How can I help?

What is expected of me?

Flexible scheduled shifts with a time commitment of 2-3 hours. Dates and times of shifts will vary depending upon the event and could be daytime, evenings or weekends.

Duties may include:

- Pick up and/or return CCD booth and materials to the local Hub.
- Booth set-up and/or tear down.
- Greet visitors at the booth.
- Hand out CCD literature and promotional items.
- Converse with visitors in promoting volunteering and CCD services and answer questions.

Events take place throughout Durham Region. Volunteer and support one of our Community Hubs: Clarington, North Durham (Cannington, Port Perry and Uxbridge), Pickering/Ajax and Whitby/Oshawa.

What training will I receive?

- CCD Orientation and Training
- Specific “on-the-job” training by the Volunteer Coordinators
- Additional training as required

What are the qualifications?

- Satisfactory Police Vulnerable Sector Check.
- Sensitive to people with needs related to aging, physical and/or mental health.
- Adhere to **COVID-19** safety practices.
- Must work in a safe manner and promote the health and safety of all staff, volunteers, clients and the community as outlined within CCD policies.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills.
