- Set and clear tables.
- Serve coffee, tea and meals.
- Provide light assistance to clients with mobility issues (no lifting or transferring).
- Escorting and assisting clients on the van.

Find a location close to you.

Volunteer at one of our Community Hubs: Clarington, North Durham (Brock, Scugog and Uxbridge), Pickering/Ajax and Whitby/Oshawa.

What training will I receive?

- CCD Orientation and Training
- Program specific training

What are the qualifications?

- Satisfactory Police Vulnerable Sector Check.
- Sensitivity to adults with needs related to aging, physical and/or mental health.
- Must work in a safe manner and promote the health and safety of all staff, volunteers, clients and the community as outlined within CCD policies.
- Physically able to work in a fast-paced environment.
